*DONNA MACKIE INTERVIEW, cont.**When and where was this?*

1988-89, in Washington, D.C., when he was director of drama for the Mount Vernon Players of D.C. (1978 to 2001). He directed the play twice maybe three times, for Players.

*How were you associated with the first performance?*

I was assistant to the director. I gave lines to the actors when they were trying to get off book. I helped build the set, select costumes, send out publicity news releases for the show.

What is your favorite part of seeing his dramatization on the boards again?

It's wonderful to have Don Taylor playing Mr. Holmes again; he played the role when OKC Theatre Company presented the play in 2008. James Gordon as Dr. Watson is another perfect choice. James was Harvey's stage manager when Harvey directed Sir Noel Coward's BLITHE SPIRIT for OKCTC in 2009. Harvey said James was the best stage manager he'd ever worked with.

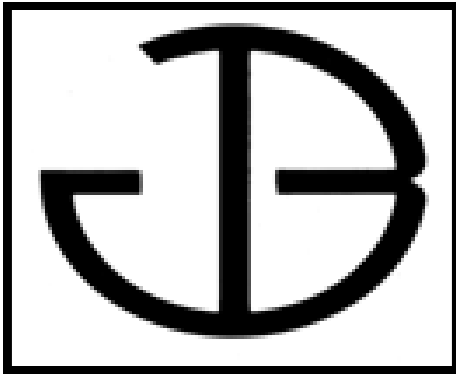
Any other thoughts?

DID YOU KNOW?

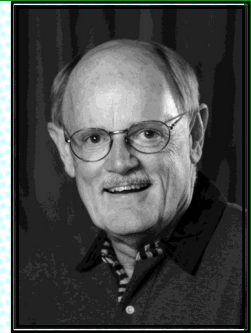

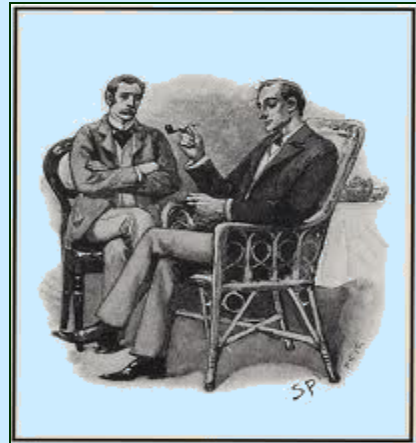
